Your Streams - EPA vs DNR

Be you a farmer, rancher, canoeist, fisherman or swimmer this will concern you. The Missouri DNR is mandated to be the watchdog of our aquatic environment. Our streams do not magically stop at the state border, they do affect Kansas and Oklahoma. Our neighbors deserve the very best quality of water we can allow to leave our state and with clean water flowing to our neighbors.

The DNR is wanting to de-list many streams, that is, remove some streams and not list many streams that contain heavy metals, harmful nutrients, bacteria and chemicals that will harm the aquatic life or people using these streams. The EPA has shown a leadership role in their protection by adding streams to the proposed DNR list that will not be allowed to be placed in the "safe to use" category. I urge all of you to go to the EPA web site for the full story, www.EPA.gov/region07/news_events/legal/index.htm and investigate the importance of the EPA's work towards environmental protection.

Our local health departments have worked tirelessly to protect these streams and these departments need our full support. I would like to challenge college students, college faculty, county commissioners, civic leaders and citizens to fully support the EPA and to hold the DNR fully accountable for our stream health. A simple letter showing support is needed and the above web site has all the details for writing to the EPA.

Quality water, important and necessary NOW and in the FUTURE, will soon be in short supply. Your life, your children's life and our nations future depend on your support for our streams. The deadline is November 24th; write to the EPA today.

What now seems like a very long time ago, I once spent six years with the United States Coast Guard. I've quite often said that the two best decisions I ever made during those years relating to service, was to get in and to get out of the Coast Guard. If you desire to know the details of that comment you'll have to ask me sometime.

I never had a long deployment, although I had several deployments that seemed very long. Missing Holidays and Birthday phone calls were the norm not the exception. Jenna my oldest daughter was two before I had even spent a total of one year with her. Recalling those days doesn't seem so bad now but they sure did seem that way, sometimes then.

None of that compares to any of our Troops currently deployed in Afghanistan or Iraq. About the time most of us will be going to sleep, Bradley Young will be waking up to another day in Kandahar, Afghanistan. Another day closer to completing a fifteen month tour which has him half a world away from his wife and family living in the Bennett Spring Area.

Many of our MTFA members are veterans of WWII, Vietnam and/or Korea. Anyone of them have a far, far better understanding than I ever will, regarding just how slowly time can pass. I have come to realize, however, that no matter what branch of service you may have served in, nothing is more disappointing or disheartening than a mail call were you get no mail. Ask any veteran and I'll bet they say the same.

At the November meeting, I'll be making a motion for the MTFA- Springfield chapter to cover the cost of shipping for a minimum of two boxes. We can vote on the recipients. I bet some of you know a few service members, maybe some are even family members or one can go to Bradley Young's unit in Afghanistan and the other to the Baghdad school of fly fishing in Iraq. I would prefer that they go out to family members of the club.

I would actually prefer we had no need to send them at all. If we're up to it we could even send additional boxes.

Each box will cost \$10.95 in postage with no weight limit. The boxes only measure 12x12 and are 5.5 inches deep. The boxes and all shipping materials are provided through a post office program. You can order your own kits by calling 1-800-610-8734 and requesting a Mil pack. Cards, letters, Coffee, Powdered drink mixes, Magazines etc... what ever fits in the box are just some of the items we can send. Member contributions will be accepted up until the December meeting. Larry Wegmann, Kim Schultz and Rod Pennington have all agreed to help collect the items. So let's fill a couple of boxes!
