Fishing Trip by Rod Pennington

Kim Schultz, Ryan McClosky and myself spent some time finding some water to fish. Taneycomo was generating, Montauk was problematic so it was decided that Bennett would be the water of choice. Arriving at Bennett brought back memories of the early 60's opening days. A fisherman literally every 8 feet. We opted for the lower Niangua and fished just below the canoe launch. At 7:30 there were well over 100 canoes preparing to launch with outfitter bringing several hundred more canoes and rafts in as we fished. Only a few small long ears were caught and released before we were moved on by the torrent of canoes. So, off to Moon Valley to fish above this MDC recreation area. More canoes! But not above the bridge. Small fish were eagerly taking small flies. Fishing this area of the Niangua was a blast from the past. Bullfrog tadpoles were found in the stream holes, a water snake carrying it's breakfast (a small fish) refused to be photographed, kingfishers raked and watched from the trees, spiders dropped into the water and the heat fell.

At noon, another attempt at Bennett. After lunch at the lodge it was noted that a number of folks had left so in the water we went. Kim caught a nice brown in the ripples below the bridge, I caught several rainbows, and Ryan's first fly-fishing trip was a success. He landed three and had several others on. As the weather cooled a bit toward dusk, the stream became much more congested and it was determined time to go. Another great day in the Ozarks.
