
The November meeting will be Thursday, November 7, 2024, at the Library Center Community Room B


January will be at C&R visit of Bennett Springs. Date to be determined.

From Kim Schultz:



From Kim Schultz: Oct 1 2024 Stockton Lake 862.05ft (v:0.35ft) air temp:70F wind: N 8-10 water temp:70F

Several of us from the club went to Stockton lake for a monthly fishing trip organized by Rod. We met at Rod's office at 1PM. Five of us (Pat, Andy, John, Rod and I) commuted in two vehicles to Hwy 245 access on Stockton Lake. We fished several points catching seven species of fish (fifteen fish caught). There was a good chop on the surface and ideal wind at the 245 points. The water is still warm (70F) with the migration of bait fish not found near the shore. We fish nearly four hours hiking out at sunset. We all good time fishing local waters.

Oct 10 2024 Lake 860.8ft (v 1.2ft) temp 61F (v 9F) Sunny E to SSE wind 4-6MPR Slight chop on surface

Rod and I fished the twin bridges on Stockton Lake. There was a light wind from the east blowing on the first point to the left. I hit the water after walking the path from the truck and fished right. The sun was in my face with a blue-gill and later a smallmouth caught and released. The wind left the area with the lake surface going flat and glassy. I did see a pair of osprey fishing the other bridge.

Rod fished the point to the left and heading to the other bridge. I walked through the woods and met Rod on the other side. The point offered a little more wave action. Rod was catching bluegill and hooked an 18" walleye, a catfish (20"), later a drum. I picked up a few bluegill, the largest was 10". As the shadows began to creep onto the lake started to pickup a few white bass. The wind switched to the SSE with little impact on the catching. As the sun tracked to the western horizon, we saw an eagle pass over the lake and we walked back to the truck. The catching was better than we anticipated due to the light winds, but did find the lake temp to be 61F with a foot drop in the lake levels.

Fishing Reports: Continued from Kim Schultz

Oct 14 2024

Lake 860.4ft (v 0.4ft) temp 64F Sunny N 4-6 good chop

Stockton Lake continues to drop (note a 5" decrease) from last week with diminishing winds later in day. We fished 245 and started at the point to the right. There were a number of birds on and over the water. A pair of osprey fishing and diving mid-lake. Several groups of geese flying overhead. I caught a small walleye, a couple smallmouth and five white bass in the 12-14" range. We moved a few hours before sunset. Rod caught fish off the jetty point, picking up half- dozen white bass, a couple largemouth bass and bluegills. We fished to sunset. I looked but did not spot a comet to the west after sunset, that was apparently visible thirty minutes after sunset.

Oct 18 2024

Lake 680.3ft (v0.1ft) water temp 63F

Weather: sunny SSE 10-15mpr

Rod and I fished the south shore near the twin bridges. Rod caught two white bass in short order and fished the point to the left. I covered water going right (west). I managed to catch one smallmouth. I moved to the cove near the bridge and started to catch white bass, another small mouth and bluegill. This happened near and after sunset. Rod found a few more fish before we called it.

OCT 25 2024 860.23ft (V 0.07ft) Temp 59F

Weather: wind switch from the south to the north 10-15MPR sunny air temp 64F


Fished twin bridges north beach., good chop on the point. I managed to pickup a bluegill and line bass fishing to the point. The rocks in this area can be hard to navigate with careful steps necessary to avoid falling. I found a few white bass off the point with fish in the 12-15" range. Rod also picked up a few white bass. As the wind settled down, the catching quit. We walked under the bridge and finished on the south beach fishing areas we caught fish on previous trips. Rod found walleye, drum, catfish and smallmouth. I followed with a large bluegill and line bass.
